STOP LEGISLATING THROUGH THE TAX CODE!

HELP BRING FAIRNESS AND SIMPLICITY TO OUR TAX SYSTEM FOR ALL AMERICANS

Dear Colleague:

Join us in making April 15th (or 17th) just *another* day! For too long the American taxpayer has financially suffered at the hands of the inefficient, overly-complex and unfair tax system currently in place. Imagine the economic freedom and purchasing power provided by a tax system that would allow us to retain 100 percent of our earnings while maintaining the benefits of government sponsored programs, and allowing them to flourish. Such would be the case under the system proposed in the Fair Tax Act, S. 13.

The Fair Tax would create a national consumption tax as the primary source of federal revenue; would eliminate our current archaic and inefficient tax code and would replace it with a simpler, fairer means of collecting revenue.

Specifically, the Fair Tax Act would repeal the individual income tax, the corporate income tax, capital gains taxes, all payroll taxes, the self-employment tax and the estate and gift taxes in lieu of a 23% tax on the final sale of all new goods and services.


Most importantly, under the Fair Tax, the federal government's revenue would go unchanged. Social Security and Medicare benefits should remain untouched under the Fair Tax bill and there would be no financial reductions to either one of these vital programs. Instead, the source of the trust-fund revenue for these two programs would be replaced simply by sales-tax revenue instead of payroll-tax revenue.

Moreover, the Fair Tax adds desperately needed transparency to ensure fair and equal tax liability across the board. Under the Fair Tax, Americans pay taxes only on what they purchase. This eliminates the excessive amount of time and money currently being expended on compliance and filing taxes.

This bill, which has companion bi-partisan legislation in the House of Representatives offered by Rep. Rob Woodall, promotes economic fairness, growth and stability. I encourage your support in this important effort.
